### Institutional Profile

The University of Guam is an open-admissions, semester-based, U.S. land-grant public comprehensive university offering 15 masters degree programs, 35 bachelors degree programs, and one (1) associates degree program in nursing. These programs are administered by the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences (“CLASS”), the College of Natural and Applied Sciences (“CNAS”), the School of Business and Public Administration (“SBPA”), the School of Education (“SOE”), and the School of Nursing and Health Sciences (“SNHS”). In addition, continuing education unit (CEU) classes, professional development training, and English language training are offered through the Office of Professional and International Programs (“PIP”).

The University of Guam has conferred over 14,550 degrees over the past 60 years.

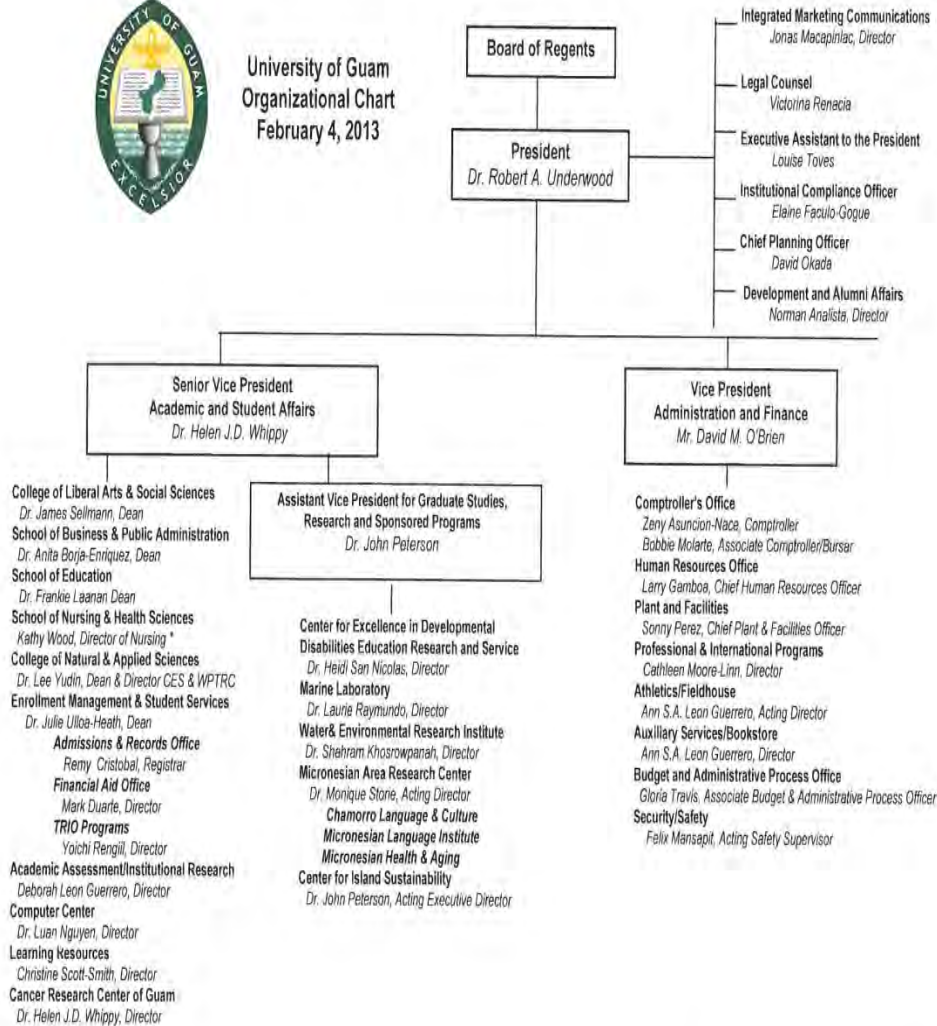

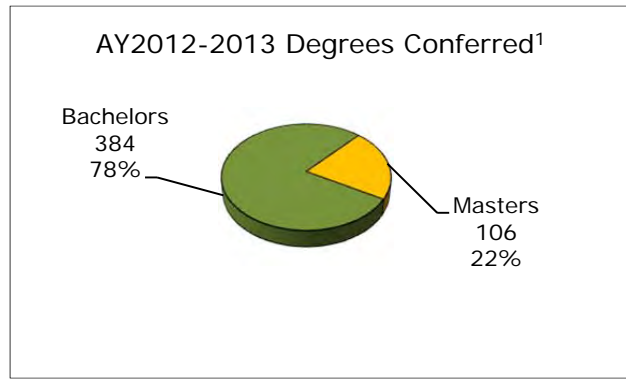

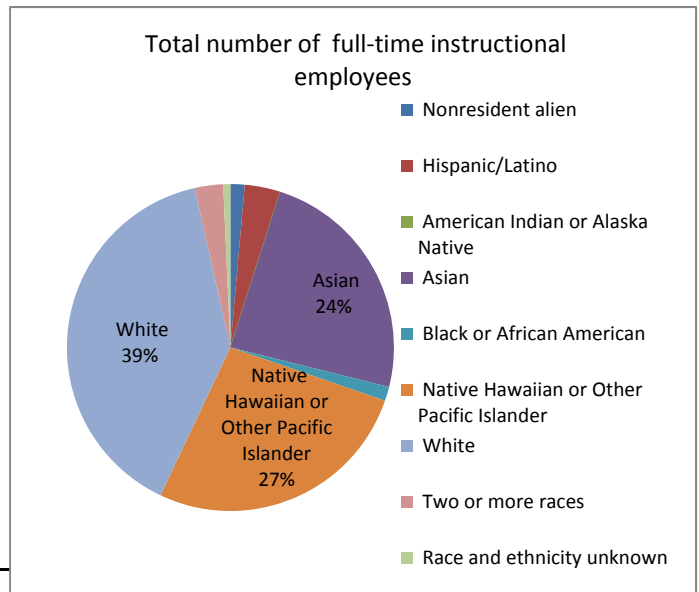

**Instruction, Research, Public Service Employee Profile**

For 2012 Fall Semester, 277 employees were assigned instruction, research, or public service as their primary function. Of the 277, there were:

- 51% men and 49% women
- 36% White, Non-Hispanic, 34% Pacific Islander, 21% Asian, and 9% Other Race or Ethnicity
- 182 (66%) were full-time, of these:
  - o 57% men, 43% women
  - o 45% White, Non-Hispanic, 22% Asian 25% Pacific Islander, 8% Other Race or Ethnicity
  - o 53% tenured, 31% on tenure track, and 15% non-tenure track 1% no faculty status
  - o 152 with tenure or tenure-track status: 43 Professors, 60 Associate Professors, 40 Assistant Professors, and 9 Instructors
  - o 24 not on tenure track: 2 Associate Professor, 6 Assistant Professors, and 16 Instructors
- 95 (34%) were part-time, of these:
  - o 40% men, 60% women
  - o 20% Asian, 49% Pacific Islander, 21% White, Non-Hispanic, 9% Other
- 275 with faculty status, of these:
  - o 65% full-time, 35% part-time
- 2 without faculty status, of these:
  - o 100% full-time

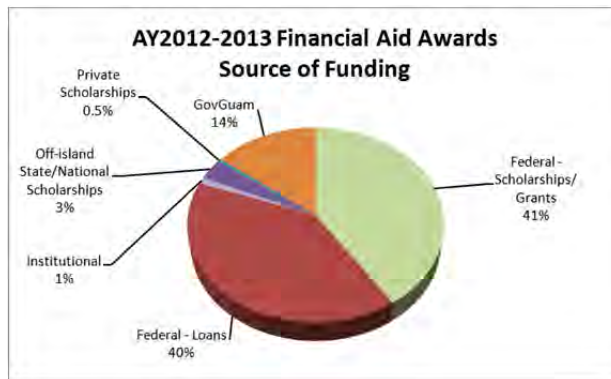

### Financial Aid Awards (AY 2012-2013)

Total financial aid awarded to students for AY2012-2013 was \$24,197,700. Of this amount 41% came from federal scholarships/grants, 40% from federal loans, 14% from GovGuam programs, 0.5% from private scholarships, 3% from regional awards, and 1% from institutional awards.

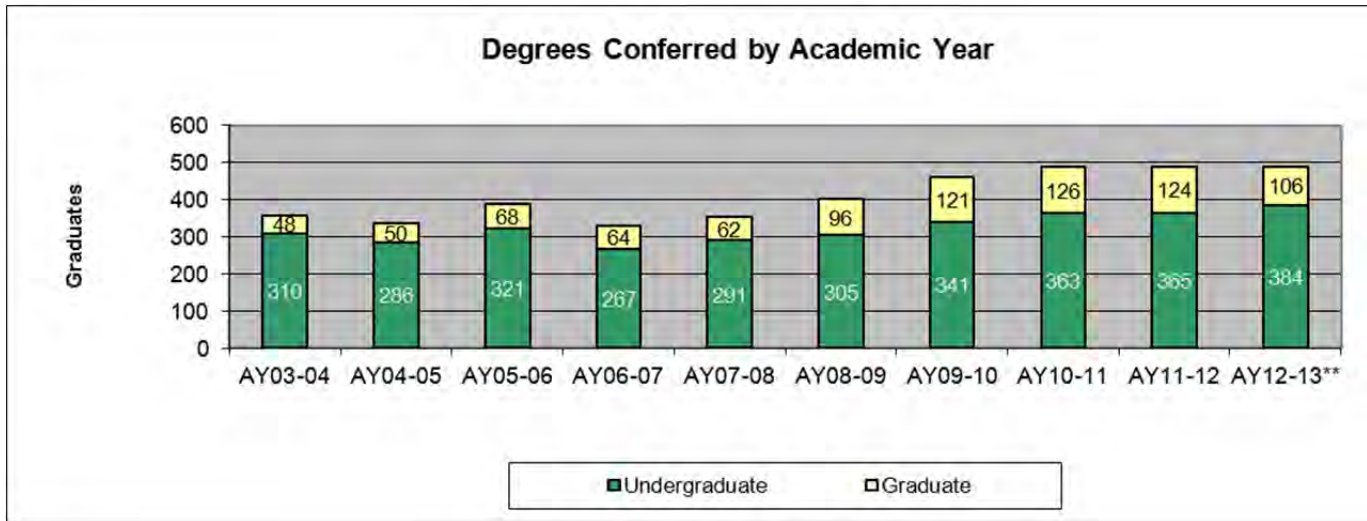

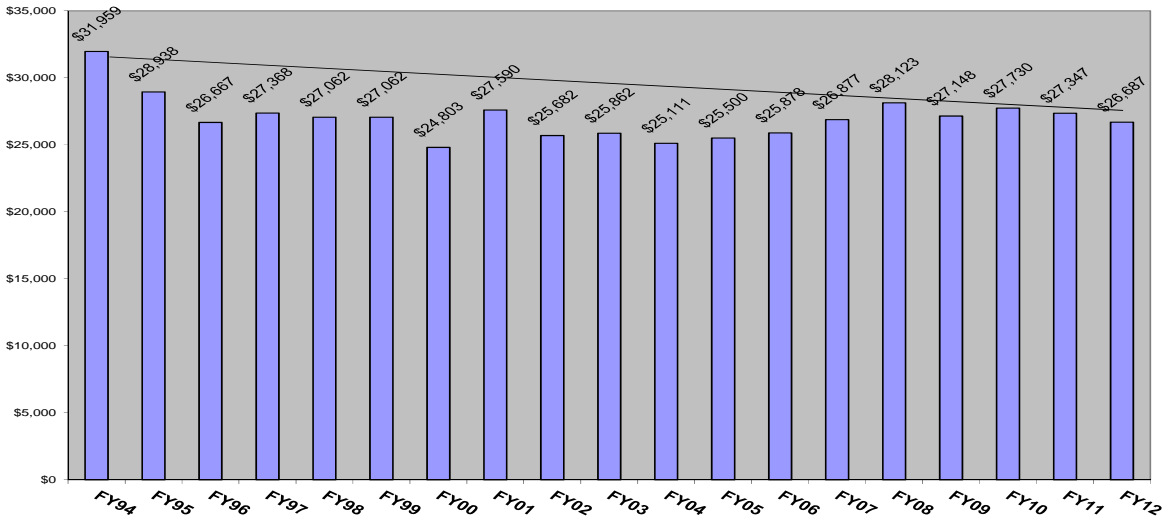

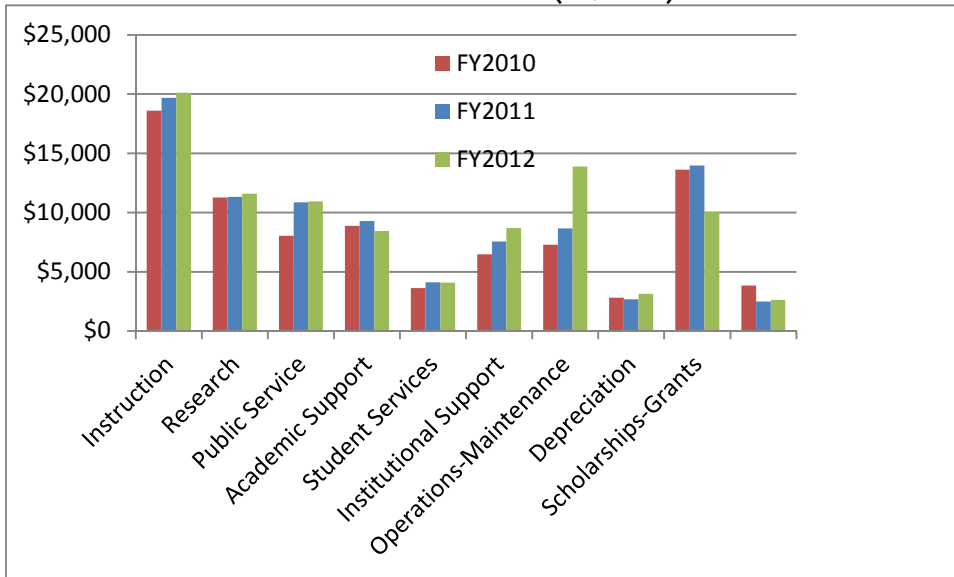

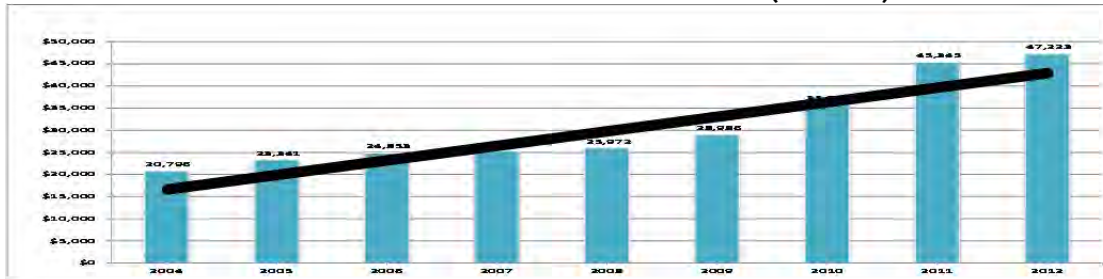
