The University of Guam is an open-admissions, semester-based, U.S. land-grant public comprehensive university offering 15 masters degree programs, 35 bachelors degree programs, and one (1) associates degree program in nursing. These programs are administered by the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences ("CLASS"), the College of Natural and Applied Sciences ("CNAS"), the School of Business and Public Administration ("SBPA"), the School of Education ("SOE"), and the School of Nursing and Health Sciences ("SNHS"). In addition, continuing education unit (CEU) classes, professional development training, and English as a Second Language (ESL) training are offered.

The University of Guam has conferred over 14,000 degrees over the past 60 years.







Instruction and Research Employee Profile

For Fall Semester 2011, 397 employees were assigned instruction, research, or public service as their primary function. Of the 397, there were:

- 45% men and 55% women
- 35% White, Non-Hispanic, 33% Pacific Islander, 23% Asian, and 10% Other Race or Ethnicity
- 185 (47%) were full-time, of these:
 - o 56% men, 44% women
 - o 47% White, Non-Hispanic, 22% Asian 22% Pacific Islander, 9% Other Race or Ethnicity
 - o 55% tenured, 32% on tenure track, and 12% non-tenure track
 - 162 with tenure or tenure-track status: 42 Professors, 65 Associate Professors, 47 Assistant Professors, and 8 Instructors
 - o 23 not on tenure track: 1 Associate Professor, 6 Assistant Professors, and 16 Instructors
- 212 (53%) were part-time, of these:
 - o 36% men, 64% women
 - 24% Asian, 42% Pacific Islander, 24% White, Non-Hispanic, 11% Other
- 329 with faculty status, of these:
 - o 56% full-time, 44% part-time
- 68 without faculty status, of these:
 - o 100% part-time


AY2011-2012 Tuition and Semester Fees
