Please provide proof that:

- UOG has secured or will secure sufficient project funding for the instant project, "New School
 of Engineering Building," which will be obtained through the US Department of Agriculture
 (USDA) Rural Development Community Facilities Loan, the Government of Guam, and/or
 other sources
- 2. The above-described funds will be used only for this "New School of Engineering Building" project and no other projects or purposes.

While we appreciate that UOG is diligently pursuing all funding options and that the USDA loan is approved, we ask these questions based upon the factors below.

- We understand that the USDA loan is not only for this project, but also for the Student Services Center project.
- At the April 28, 2022, Second Reading hearing on Bill No. 197-36, it was testified that the
 quoted price for the Student Services Center project was \$22.9M as of July 2021, which
 exceeds the total USDA loan amount of \$21.7M.
- It was also testified, at the April 28, 2022 hearing, that UOG is able to commit only \$2M of its own funds toward this project and the Student Services Center project.

Thus, we need to verify that sufficient funding has been or will be secured for this specific project and will not be used for anything else including other ongoing construction projects by UOG.

Dear USDA:

The University of Guam has requested that we provide your office with this letter to confirm the availability of \$7.1 million needed to fill the anticipated budgetary shortfall for the School of Engineering and Student Success Center. In the fall of 2021, UOG President, Dr. Krise, approached Governor Lou Leon Guerrero for financial assistance to keep this project moving forward. Governor Leon Guerrero agreed to cover the \$7.1M shortfall, using approximately half of Guam's allocated CORONAVIRUS CAPITAL PROJECTS FUND.

In December 2021 this project request was transmitted to the U.S. Department of Treasury. Shortly thereafter, the Treasury advised that all of Guam's funds have been approved. This letter confirms that \$7.1 million has been assigned to UOG for the construction of the School of Engineering and the Student Success Center facilities to augment the USDA Rural Development RD Loan of \$21.7 million.
